Boards and Commissions

C.E.R.T.

The Fire Division is currently organizing Community Emergency Response Team (C.E.R.T.) Training free of charge! Using their training, C.E.R.T. members can assist others in their neighborhoods or workplaces during an event when professional responders are not immediately available

C.E.R.T. educates citizens about:

- Disaster preparedness
- Basic disaster response skills
- Fire safety Light search and rescue
- Team organization
- Disaster medical operations

Who can join?

Eligible citizens are anyone who lives or works in Moraine or the surrounding area, who are 18 years old or older.

Citizens to Vote on Income Tax Issue

The filing due date for the 2018 tax year is Monday, April 15, 2019.

ALL RESIDENTS who live in the City for the entire year or partial year are required to file a City income tax return with the Tax Division on an annual basis, whether or not a tax is due.

Each garden plot will require a \$15 fee for residents/\$20 fee for non-residents paid (each year). Plot registration happens in two phases:

Phase I

March 1st, for all 2018 plot users who cleared their lot at the conclusion of the growing year.

Phase II

March 15th, for new gardeners.

Participants must pay for plots at the time of registration and confirm their plot section. We are only able to guarantee plots used in 2018 in phase I. For example if a gardener had plots 3 & 4 in 2018, they may have 3 & 4 in Phase I. If they wish to switch plots they will need to wait until Phase II.



The History Behind Blanchard Avenue

When Charles Kettering, Col. Edward Deeds and Orville Wright began the new Dayton Wright Airplane Company on Springboro Pike, streets were being laid out in a small plat to the east of the plant. Many of the streets were named after famous inventors such as Steinmetz, Edison, Fulton and Marconi.

At some point Edison Avenue, named after Thomas Edison, was changed to Blanchard Avenue. The mystery was when and why was it changed and who was Blanchard? *The answer is Thomas Blanchard, called by many as the "father of the assembly line".*

How prophetic as the assembly line was a mainstay not only for the Dayton Wright Airplane Company in 1918 but also for future Moraine businesses that occupied those large buildings along Springboro Pike for the next 100 years – Frigidaire, Delco-Light, General Motors Assembly Plant & Fuyao Glass America.

Thomas Blanchard (June 24, 1788 – April 16, 1864) was an American inventor who lived much of his life in Springfield, Massachusetts, where in 1819, he pioneered the assembly line style of mass production in America, and also invented the major technological innovation known as interchangeable parts. Blanchard worked, for much of his career, with the Springfield Armory. In 1825, Blanchard also invented America's first car, which he called a "horseless carriage," powered by steam. During Blanchard's lifetime, he was awarded over twenty-five patents for his creations.

Garden Plot Information

Garden Plot size is 20' x 90'. The 78 garden plots are located on Vance Road at the end of Dorf Drive, near the entrance to German Village. Plot must be planted by May 20th or will be reclaimed by the City. Weed control during the summer and early fall is important. If weeds overgrow the plot, the user will lose the plot. All plots must be cleared by November 1, 2019. Any Participant who does not clear his or her plot of stakes and other items which could damage a tractor during plowing will lose their gardening privileges for the next year.
