Progress Through Unity

NNO IS AUGUST 3 AT PRC 6PM - 8PM

City Construction Tydate

Please drive cautiously and respect all construction zones. These zones are set up to protect the workers and drivers!

Pinnacle Ridge Final Paving

The final surface paving of all roadways within the Pinnacle Ridge subdivision will be complete this Summer/Fall.

2021 Paving Program

Pinnacle Road (from Vance Road to Main Street) will be paved with Vance Road later this Summer/Fall.

Vance Road Resurfacing

Vance Road will be resurfaced from Main Street to the City's northern corporation limit. This project is partially funded by a federal grant through the Ohio Department of Transportation and MVRPC. This project is expected to be complete by October 2021.

Haverstick South Improvements

Roadway resurfacing, curb replacement, and curb ramp installation will be completed on Lehigh Place, Pensacola Blvd., Lauderdale Drive, Nyack Lane, Jomar Avenue, Genoa Avenue, Butler Avenue and Mays Avenue. Construction is expected to be complete by October 2021. This project is partially funded by a Community Development Block Grant through Montgomery County.

City Crack Sealing Program

The City will be conducting crack sealing operations on thoroughfares and main roads throughout the City in 2021. This will help prolong the life of our roadways. This is a rolling operation and moves very quickly. Please follow the directions of work crews and respect the construction vehicles. This project is expected to be complete by Fall 2021.

STORM SEWER VS. SANITARY SEWER

Storm sewers are designed to prevent flooding and transport rainwater that falls in communities via the storm drain system, called a Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (or MS4 for short) which includes streets, curbing, gutters, catch basins, underground piping, channels, washes, etc. Stormwater is redirected to canals, parks, community lakes, retention basins and drywells without treatment.



Sanitary sewers take wastewater (from household and commercial uses i.e. sinks, toilets, washers, etc.) and carry it through an underground separate sewer pipe to a wastewater treatment plant where pollutants are removed.


Great Job!

RESEARCH, DISCOVER AND UNCOVER MORAINE'S HISTORY

WRIGHT BROTHERS PRESENCE IN MORAINE By: Dave Miller

Although it has been 100 to 120 years ago, the Wright Brothers have left a substantial presence in the City of Moraine.

Three Moraine Historical Markers identify major Wright Brothers accomplishments:

- The Wright Seaplane Base along the Miami River marks one of the world's first seaplane bases
- The Pinnacles just west off of Main Street hill is where the brothers observed large birds in flight and came up with their wing design for the eventual airplane.
- The Dayton Wright Airplane Company on Springboro Pike built the nation's first bomber in 1917 for use in World War I.



But there is more Wright Brothers aviation history coming! Currently, the new housing subdivision Wright Landing on Vance Road, Moraine's second aviation themed housing project, has streets named Aviation Trail

and Wright Way. Now in development is the Wright Brothers Pinnacles Hiking Trail. This 1.1 mile joint hiking and mountain bike trail will provide historical message boards with vintage photos taken by the Wright Brothers in the late 1800's at the Pinnacles and at the bridge behind the Pinnacles. One trailhead will begin 1/4 mile north of the entrance to Wax

Park along the Main Street Bike Trail. A second trailhead begins 100 yards west of the Main Street/Pinnacle Road WRIGHT LANDING

intersection along the Pinnacle Road Bike Trail. The trail is projected to be completed by 2022.

Lastly, The Wright Seaplane Base Inc. organization will donate to the City a 1/4 scale model of a circa 1913 Wright Hydro-Aeroplane (seaplane). The model and plaque tell the story of Orville Wright's testing and development of the plane along the nearby Great Miami River in Moraine. Projected completion and installation will be in 2022 tentatively in the greenspace area along the bike trail at 3300 Main Street.

Rules:

- All Vehicles must check-in and report between 8:30 a.m. and 9:00 a.m., racing begins at 10:00 a.m.
- All Drivers/Teams must sign a liability waiver (participants 6-17 are required to have parent or guardian sign the liability consent form)
- All vehicles will be inspected prior to 10:00am on race day and must meet all safety requirements in order to compete
- Each vehicle must accelerate from starting line by gravity without aid of external propulsion devices including human power

Race Divisions:

Ages 6-12, 13-17, 18 & up

Vehicle Design:

- Freestyle Construction any creative entry is acceptable providing it meets the below criteria
- Size: Maximum width: no wider than 42 inches, Maximum length: no longer than 7 feet
- Wheels: must have four wheels. Any type and size of wheel is legal
- Body: must have side walls and can be any material as long as the body is not in contact with the ground while in motion
- Braking System: vehicle must have some form of braking system which could be some type of drag brake
- Steering: most forms of steering are acceptable (such as rope steering or a solid fixed rod steering wheel) "tiller steering" is prohibited (this is where the steering wheel moves right or left and is not fixed solid)
- All vehicles must have an evenook in the front of the car so that it can be towed up the hill
- No obscene or disrespectful stickers, writing, drawings, etc. on vehicle or driver apparel. All must be in good taste.

Driver Safety:

- Mandatory: Helmets, Eye Goggles/Glasses, Shoes (no open toed sandals)
- Gloves are recommended
- Costumes are encouraged
- · Hand, feet inside vehicle at all times (feet cannot be used for braking, arms or legs cannot be used to propel the vehicle)
- Driver must remain in vehicle until all vehicles have crossed the finish line


